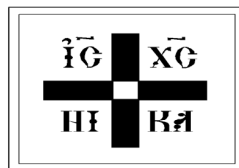

3rd Antiphon: The Resurrection Apolytikion of the Day - Tone 1:

(Του λιθου σφραγισθεντος...- Though the tomb was sealed...)

Though the tomb was sealed by a stone and soldiers guarded your pure body, you arose O Savior on the third day giving life to the world. Therefore O Giver of Life, the heavenly powers praise you. Glory to your resurrection O Christ, Glory to your kingdom, Glory to your plan of redemption, O only one who loves mankind. Page 170.

Eisodikon (Hymn of the Entrance):

(Δευτε προσκυνησωμεν...- Come let us worship...)

Come, let us worship and bow down before Christ. Save us, O Son of God, who rose from the dead, save us who sing to you: Alleluia.

In you, holy mother Pelagia, the angel of God shone forth, for you took up your cross and followed the Lord. By word and example you taught us to live in the spirit while still in the flesh. Therefore your spirit rejoices with the angels for ever.

Hymn of the Church — Tone 4:

(Ως των αιχμαλωτων ελευθερωτις... - As the one renowned for setting captives free,...)

As the one renowned for setting captives free, * and for defending those in poverty, * the

physician of the sick and the champion of kings, * do thou, o Victory-bearer and Great Martyr George, * intercede to Christ our God * for the salvation of our souls.

Kontakion - Tone 2:

(Προστασια των Χριστιανων... - O unfailing protection...)

O unfailing protection of Christians, and our faithful advocate before the Creator: though we are sinners, do not ignore our entreaty, but in your goodness, grant your timely help to us who appeal to you in faith. Quickly make intercession; on our behalf make speedy supplication, O Theotokos, for you always protect those who honor you.
