

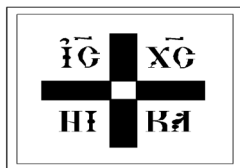

3rd Antiphon: The Resurrection Apolytikion of the Day - Tone 3:

(Ευφραίνεσθω τα ουρανια...– Let the heavens rejoice...)

Let the heavens rejoice and the earth be glad, for the Lord has shown the mighty power of his arm. He has trampled down death by death, becoming the first born of the dead. He has delivered us from the depths of hell and has granted to all the world great mercy. Page 170.

Eisodikon (Hymn of the Entrance):

(Δευτε προσκυνησωμεν...– Come let us worship...)

Come, let us worship and bow down before Christ. Save us, O Son of God, who rose from the dead, save us who sing to you: Alleluia.

The Resurrection Apolytikion of the Day - Tone 3:

(Ευφραίνεσθω τα ουρανια...– Let the heavens rejoice...)

The Apolytikion of the Feast (Conception of St. Anna) - Tone 4:

(Συμερον της ατεκνιας– Today the bonds of childlessness...)

Today the bonds of childlessness are broken. For hearing the prayers of Joachim and Anne, God promised that against all hope they would give birth to the Maiden of God. He, the Uncircumcised, would be born of her, when e would become man, and by the Angel's example, He commanded us to call to her: "Rejoice, Maiden full of grace, the Lord is with you."

(Ως των αιχμαλωτων ελευθερωτις... - As the one renowned for setting captives free,...)

As the one renowned for setting captives free, * and for defending those in poverty, * the

physician of the sick and the champion of kings, * do thou, o Victory-bearer and Great Martyr George, * intercede to Christ our God * for the salvation of our souls.

Kontakion of the Feast (Conception) - Tone 3:

(Εορταζει σημερον η οικουμενη..– Today the whole world celebrates...)

Today the whole world celebrates the Conception of Anne provided by God Himself, for Anne has borne the Pure One who will give birth to the Word of God in a manner that is beyond all telling.
